CATECHISM OF PIUS X The Fifth Commandment

- 8 Q. Is dueling also forbidden by the Fifth Commandment?
A. Yes, dueling is ... forbidden by the Fifth Commandment, because dueling has in it the guilt both of suicide and of homicide; and whoever voluntarily takes part in it, even as a simple onlooker, is excommunicated.
- 9 Q. Is dueling also forbidden when there is no danger of being killed?
A. This sort of dueling is also forbidden, because not only are we forbidden to kill, but even voluntarily to wound ourselves or others.
- 10 Q. Is the defense of one's honor an excuse for dueling?
A. No, because it is not true that the offence is repaired by dueling; and because honor cannot be repaired by an unjust, irrational and barbarous act such as dueling.
- 11 Q. What does the Fifth Commandment command?
A. The Fifth Commandment commands us to forgive our enemies and to wish well to all.
- 12 Q. What should he do who has injured another in the life of either body or soul?
A. He who has injured another must not only confess his sin, but must also repair the harm by compensating his neighbor for the loss he has sustained, by retracting the errors taught, and by giving good example.

**Sunday - July 18, 2021
Gospel Reading
Mark 6:30-34**



Jesus invites his disciples to rest after their ministry, and Jesus is moved with pity for the crowds who pursue them.

In this today's Gospel, we read the report of the return of the Twelve, who were sent by Jesus to preach repentance, heal the sick, and drive out demons. When the Twelve return to Jesus, he invites them to come away from the crowds and rest. But the crowds will not give them peace. As the Twelve have shared in Jesus' ministry, they now appear to share in his popularity. The crowds continue to approach them, and Mark reports that the disciples don't even have time to eat. In an effort to get away, Jesus and his disciples board a boat in hopes of finding a deserted place. But the crowds notice this and arrive ahead of them. The crowds are so persistent that Jesus and his disciples cannot find a place to be alone. Mark's Gospel tells us that Jesus is moved with pity and begins to teach the crowds.

Our Gospel for today stops here, but Mark's report of the unyielding demands of the crowd continues in the verses that follow. If we were to continue reading from Mark's Gospel, we would hear Jesus instruct his disciples to feed the crowd in the familiar miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes. The work of Jesus and his disciples appears to be a round-the-clock job. In the next few weeks, we will hear the story of Jesus' feeding of the multitude, but our Lectionary will turn to the sixth chapter of the Gospel of John to report and reflect on this story.

In today's Gospel, we hear the Twelve referred to as "apostles." The word *apostle* is a Greek word meaning "one who is sent." Jesus chose twelve men from among his disciples whom he sent to share in his ministry of preaching and healing. The first report of this is found in the third chapter of Mark's Gospel, where the Twelve are also called apostles and the names of this select group are listed.

We who are Jesus' disciples today have also been sent to share the Gospel with others. Perhaps our commitment to following Jesus as his disciple leaves us feeling tired and overwhelmed. In today's Gospel, we hear Jesus affirm the importance of times of rest and renewal. Jesus wanted his disciples to come away and spend time alone with him. This is what we seek and find in our life of prayer and in our celebration of the Eucharist.

A Well-Formed Conscience



The Church equips its members to address political and social questions by helping them to develop a well-formed conscience. Catholics have a serious and lifelong obligation to form their consciences in accord with human reason and the teaching of the Church. Conscience is not something that allows us to justify doing whatever we want, nor is it a mere "feeling" about what we should or should not do. Rather, conscience is the voice of God resounding in the human heart, revealing the truth to us and calling us to do what is good while shunning what is evil. Conscience always requires serious attempts to make sound moral judgments based on the truths of our faith. As stated in the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, "Conscience is a judgement of reason whereby the human person recognizes the moral quality of a concrete act that he is going to perform, is in the process of performing, or has already completed. In all he says and does, man is obliged to follow faithfully what he knows to be just and right".

Due to recent issues with theft from the dock area, we ask that all donations be left during store hours only:



Please register your children as soon as possible to allow us to be well prepared for the new school year.

- We offer an early bird discount for registrations paid in full, until Aug. 5. We ask for a minimum of 25% of tuition to be paid at registration.
- Religious Education classes begin August 22, 2021.
- Teachers and assistants receive a 50% discount on tuition for their children. Call the Church or stop by during business hours if you have questions or to volunteer.
- Now that the dispensation for Holy Mass attendance has been lifted, please remember, as Catholics we are required to attend Holy Mass on Sunday (or one of the vigil Masses on Saturday), in keeping with the Third Commandment. We strongly encourage families to attend Holy Mass with their children in fulfillment of this requirement.
- Children who are preparing for the Sacraments of First Eucharist or Confirmation will be required to sign in to indicate attendance at Holy Mass, for the 2021-22 RE school year.
- We will hold a Religious Education Registration Weekend on July 31-August 1, following Holy Masses at 4:00 p.m. on Saturday, and both Holy Masses on Sunday. Stop by the RE table in front of the church to pick up registration forms, to turn in completed forms, to volunteer, or to ask any questions you may have about the program. We look forward to talking with you.



The Sacrament of Baptism

To schedule a Baptism, parents and Godparents are first required to attend a Baptism Preparation class. Please email ahew@svdpatl.com to register for the class.

Baptisms will not be officially scheduled until parents and Godparents have attended the class and all paperwork has been turned in.

The paperwork includes a St. Vincent de Paul Parish registration packet (if the family is not already registered), the Baptism registration form and sponsor certificates for the Godmother and Godfather.

Baptisms are not scheduled to take place during the seasons of Advent or Lent.
